Even the hate-filled murder of an innocent shopkeeper in Glasgow or the senseless murder of a young girl in Clydebank could easily test the faith of anyone.

Social media reflected the despair felt by many. How? Why? It is difficult to answer such questions. However, that is exactly what the terrorist wants to achieve for once we have lost our faith, he has won. Martin Luther King said that, “Faith is about taking the first step even when you don’t see the whole staircase”.

It is important that we take from the example of Asad Shah, the devout Muslim shopkeeper in Glasgow, murdered by a religious fanatic for simply posting a message of love, wishing a happy Easter to all his Christian friends. As a result of this dreadful act, people, of all persuasions across Glasgow, united in their outpouring of grief and respect for this man. He will be remembered long after the perpetrator of the crime has gone to stand in judgement before his Maker. It is these small acts that allow us to take the next step in Martin Luther King’s staircase of faith.

As is always the case, we are reminded of this in the scriptures, in Matthew 13:22; “It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches.”

This is the last West Column of the session and my thanks go to all who have contributed over the last eight months. At the end of April the lodges go into a welcome recess in order to allow (some of us anyway) to recharge batteries. There are still lots of events scheduled throughout the summer months and I hope that you will be able to find time to support as many as you can.

Marcus Humphrey House:

There are a number of events being held to mark the 25th anniversary of the opening of the Marcus Humphrey House, which is, of course, within the Province of Renfrewshire West.

Firstly there will be a zip line challenge being jointly organised by the Provinces of Lanarkshire Middle Ward, Ayrshire, Glasgow, Renfrewshire East and Renfrewshire West.

We will be promoting this event over the next few weeks, which is being jointly organised by a number of the neighbouring Provinces, including Renfrewshire West in order to raise funds for the chosen charity of Grand Lodge, Prostate Cancer Scotland.

This is a Scottish charity set up to provide information, advice and help on prostate health and diseases of the prostate. Nearly 1 in 2 men in Scotland will be affected by prostate disease at some stage in their lives and 1 in 11 are likely to develop prostate cancer. Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men in Scotland. To bring this into perspective, of the nearly 500 brethren now on the direct distribution list for this edition of the West Column, around 40, will suffer from prostate cancer and I urge you to give your earnest consideration to supporting this charitable effort.

Participants:

I am pleased to be able to confirm that following my request for "volunteers" to take part in this event, I received names from Lodges XII, 175, 217, 626, 1121 and 1425. At first the Province was only allocated 5 spaces but after an impassioned plea to the chief organiser, this has been increased to ten spaces. My thanks go to all who submitted their names and those not selected will be placed on a reserve list in case more spaces become available but the lucky ones taking part are;

Following registration (cost £50 which covers the running costs of the event), each participant will be asked to raise a further £200 which, if achieved, will realise the target total of between £30,000 - £35,000. All participants are now in possession of the relevant sponsor forms.

The event will take place on Saturday 14th May with participants assembling on the south side of the Clyde near the BBC offices, where they will be harnessed up before making their way on foot across the bridge to the Finnieston crane. There they will be hoisted up to a height of around 150 feet in a basket before being attached to the wire and launched back across the river. Simple!

Brethren it is hoped that ALL of the lodges and individual brethren will embrace this effort and whether your lodge has a brother taking part or not, that you will all lend your very best support to the challenge.
