

The West Column



Practice makes perfect or so the old saying goes.

My granddaughter has taken up the clarinet! It's OK I don't want your sympathy, even although the house now resounds to what I can only describe as painful shrieks making it sound as if there is a Hallow'een party underway.

As a former horn, euphonium and double bass player, my liking has always been for the premier section of the band, the brass of course (sorry Allan Glen), so to have to listen to the sounds of an embryonic Acker Bilk is not the most enjoyable time of the day!

In fairness, the shrieks have been getting less and the quality of the full rounded notes is a little bit more in evidence as she undertakes her 30 minutes practice every day (is it only 30 minutes)? Whether this is helped by my comments of "that sounds better Kaitlyn, practice makes perfect" or not, I'm not sure. I do keep saying to her though, that if a job is worth doing, it's worth doing well.

Criticism should be healthy, it should be encouraging but it should be gently offered. Past Masters in particular often get a bad name, sometimes deserved it must be said, of making unhelpful comments – "it wasn't done like that in my term" etc. Indeed, later in the Column, you will see that you can even purchase a "Grumpy Old Past Master" badge.

If truth be told, such criticism is not restricted to Past Masters but it seems that anyone who offers to undertake work of any kind for the Lodge can be subjected to criticism from all parts. Maybe it's a Scottish thing. "I'm not willing to do the work myself but that will not stop me having a go at someone else".

How much better and how much more appreciated is a word of gentle guidance or encouragement? How often do we hear of office-bearers being criticised because they "are not carrying out the office as they should be"!

Has anyone actually taken the time to explain the duties of the office?

Which brings me to the point of this leader this month. As we head into the installation season, I would appeal to those senior brethren who are taking part in the installation ceremonies to be sure to take time to explain the duties of the office to each Brother being installed. I spoke of this at the recent communication of Provincial Grand Lodge.

It is disappointing to hear a Brother being installed into office with the words, "you have been doing this job for 10 years, so there is no point in me telling you your duties".

Firstly, he may very well have been in office for 10 years but has the job been done correctly? Secondly and more importantly, there will inevitably be brethren present at an installation for the first time, they will not have heard the ritual and they will not be aware of the duties attached to each office. Is it any wonder that some problems occur if we do not adequately prepare brethren for their future career in the Lodge?

Is it any wonder that sometimes attendances at installation meetings are low if we take a half-hearted approach to the ritual work involved? What would happen at a normal degree meeting if someone went on the floor and simply said, "most of you have heard the tools before, so I'll not bother going through the whole ritual"?

So brethren, I make this appeal to all who are involved in forthcoming installations to make them special, not only for the brethren being installed but also for the brethren attending the ceremony and most importantly, for the next generation of potential office-bearers.

And for those seasoned ritualists, be gentle with your criticism, it is much more likely to be held in high regard.

A last word on the clarinet practice, I fear my granddaughter may have Van Gogh's ear for music but we shall persevere with a kindly word and much loved encouragement. In fairness, as a clarinet player, she's a brilliant gymnast!

This will ensure that the Motion is in an acceptable format and avoid any delays caused by having to have the proposal reworded and resubmitted.

Application forms are also still available within each Lodge. If you have not already "signed up" I hope that you will give your earnest consideration to this excellent method of charity fund-raising which should at the same time, assist in boosting attendance figures throughout the Lodges. Otters Cheque presentation:

Swimmers from Port Glasgow Otters have been selected to represent Scotland West at next year's Special Olympics National Summer Games. Katie Boyle, Lindi Steele, Ross O'Donnell and Aimee Hagan will all participate in the five day event which will be held in Sheffield in August 2017. Andrew Hemphill, a coach from Port Glasgow Otters, has also been selected as a team coach for the event. Special Olympics GB is the largest provider of a year-round, all ability, sports program in the United Kingdom and supports over 10,000 athletes with intellectual (learning) disabilities on a continued basis. The National Summer Games is held every four years within different Cities across the U.K. The competitors and coach, Andrew Hemphill, need to raise a total of at least £2500, £500 each, to cover the participation costs for the event. After a fundraiser held at 626 the Lodge became aware of the level of funds the kids had to raise just to send themselves to the Special Olympics.



After a most successful first run of our 'Charity Chase the Ace' this seemed a very appropriate use for the funds which had been raised from all the Brethren of the Province and beyond. 
A little piece of culture for you all!
