Bro Warnock Aitchison Park (1923-2017)

During the recess, we received an email from Bro Peter R Sinclair PM, now residing down south. Peter said, 'I noticed today in the online Tele the death of Warnock Park. Warnock Was 94 and I have a very distant memory when I went into the Chair (in 1987) Warnock had mentioned to me that he was a No XII man, but had not been in many a long year. I thought I'd let you know in case nobody else noticed'. I did notice the death and was drawn by the unusual name but had no knowledge of a No XII connection. On checking, Bro Warnock was Initiated on 26th June 1944. He was 21 at the time of his Initiation and his occupation was given as Storehouse Assistant. Bro Warnock was passed on 7th September 1944 and Raised on 26th October 1944.

Peter remembered Warnock as 'a real gent, was always dapper whenever you met him and had a wicked sense of humour plus a general disdain for management'. Although we didn't see him around the Lodge, he does sound like our type of guy!!

Bro Rev Donald Beaton (1932 - 2017)

Rev Donald Beaton was minister in The Gaelic Parish Church when he joined No XII in 1962. He was initiated on 6th February, Passed on 20th February 1962 and Raised on March 6th 1962. Residing at the Gaelic Parish manse – 63 Brisbane Street – he had been born in Staffin on the Isle of Skye in 1933. Bro Rev Beaton was fluent in Gaelic as was necessary for a minister of the Gaelic Parish which had services in Gaelic as well as English. Rev Beaton left Greenock in 1965 to become an Army Chaplain. He was known as 'the Climbing Padre' in the Black Watch because of his love of mountaineering which he promoted in the regiment.

Sadly, Rev Beaton was the last minister of the Gaelic Parish which united with the West Kirk in Nelson Street to form the Old Kirk in 1966. After subsequent unions the church is now the Westburn. Bro Beaton passed away in his native Skye in June.

The Gaelic Parish had strong links with No XII as its ministers in the early part of the 20th Century were members and Divine Services were held there. The church was demolished and Greenock's very first Tesco built on the site at the corner of Jamaica Street and West Stewart Street. The old Tesco store is now occupied by Iceland.

I have an affinity with this obituary as my family attended The Gaelic Parish and I was baptised there in 1954. I can remember Rev Beaton as minister when I was a wee boy.

Bro Rev Alexander McIsaac (1926 – 2017)

Bro Alex McIsaac joined No XII in 1986 when he was 60 years of age! Although 'wee Alex' came to Freemasonry relatively late in life, he flung himself into it enthusiastically becoming a member of the General Committee and then an Office Bearer in No XII. Bro Alex was a draughtsman by profession and was Initiated on 7th October 1986, Passed on 16th December 1986 and Raised on 17th February 1987. Bro Alex was a keen booler and played at that hotbed of freemasonry, the Ardgowan Club. A cheerful, generous man he attended the Lodge very regularly until, in later years, his health prevented it. He passed to the Grand Lodge Above on 6th July 2017 and was in his 92nd year.

Refurbishment of The Lodge Memorial Altar

A memorial to members who fell in The Great War

Bro Alistair Glenny PM has been devoting his considerable skills and talents to the upgrading of a number of the No XII artefacts. His most recent project has been the No XII Memorial Altar. Bro Alistair sent me the following:

As we enter the final half of 2017 and the first part of 2018 our attention is likely to be drawn on many occasions to the inscription and names on our Memorial Altar. It was unveiled and dedicated on Friday 31st March 1922 and used since then by candidates, as they take their oaths in our various degrees.

In readiness for such attention, the Altar, of Gothic design, and made of fine Scottish Oak, has been cleaned and refurbished, including the lettering, to reflect the dignity placed upon it by Lodge Office Bearers and Brethren.



From Arras to Alamein, Passchendaele to Palermo, the Scottish Soldier has been famous, prompting many verses dedicated to his bravery and love for his kinsmen. One such verse on the 51st Highland Division being:-

Ye canna mak' a sojer wi' braid an' trappin's braw,
Nor gie him fightin' spirit when his back's ag'in the wa'
It's the breedin' in the callants that winna let them whine'
the bluid o' generations frae lang, lang syne
Patrick Delaforce/Monty's Highlanders

From the old Minute Books of No XII

The text above has a report about the No XII Mark Degree. The Minute extract below details the gift of Mark Tools from Lodge Crawfurdsburn Greenock No 1121. No XII has received several gifts from Lodge Crawfurdsburn over the years.

Wednesday 22nd March 1916

Presentation of Mark Tools from Lodge Crawfurdsburn No1121

The RW Master expressed the pleasure it gave him to acknowledge another gift from Lodge Crawfurdsburn No 1121. On this occasion it took the form of Mark Tools consisting of 4 Gavels, 3 Chisels, 3 Set Squares and 1 T Square.

The tools are used to this day.
