#### Our Next Meeting Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> January 2018



The meeting on Tuesday will be a busy one. Firstly, and most importantly, we have the presentation of a jewel from the Lodge to Bro Kenneth Kennedy Morrison PM, or KK as he is affectionately known to us all, to mark his being honoured was by the Grand Master Mason at The Annual Installation of Grand Lodge on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> November 2017. The Grand Master bestowed Honorary Grand Rank of Grand Architect upon him. In masonic parlance, this recognition of Kenny is "peculiarly appropriate and well deserved." Bro Kenny is the first member of No XII to be so honoured since the late Bro John Adamson PM in the 1990s. Before that it was the late Bro Archie Campbell PM in the 1970s who received Honorary Grand Rank.

Funnily enough, when I was in the Lodge on Friday doing some work on the archives I came across the Certificate that Bro Archie Campbell received all these years ago and the jewel that had been given to Bro John Adamson by the Lodge.



The lodge will be closed after the business because at 8pm, Donald MacDonald, Trophy Convenor for the Inverclyde Music Festival, will be along to be presented with the Wilson J McCulloch Trophy (photo left) by the Lodge. A cheque will also be handed over as a donation to help the work of the Festival in which many hundreds of local people – mostly children – take part in each year. This continues the Lodge's emphasis on outreach into the community.

The trophy will be presented for verse speaking in the Primary 6 age group. Wilson of course was a very highly qualified and extremely accomplished elocutionist. He was very successful in the Festival competitions in his youth.

RWPGM Bro James P Livingstone and a deputation from the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West will be in attendance and the RWPGM will assist with both presentations. Bro KK Morrison PM is, of course, presently a Provincial Grand office bearer and the late Bro Wilson J McCulloch served with distinction as Provincial Grand Chaplain. Bro Wilson is seen in the photograph on the right in the Provost's Room at his Installation into the Chair of King Solomon in November 1977. He presided, with dignity, expertise and aplomb, over the Lodge 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations in December 1978 when the Grand Master Mason, Bro Captain Robert Wolridge Gordon,10<sup>th</sup> of Esslemont and 21<sup>st</sup> of, (father of the present Grand Master), and a deputation visited for a rededication ceremony in the Town Hall Saloon and a Dinner at the Tontine Hotel.



Finally, the Lodge room having been rearranged suitably, there will be an illustrated lecture from Bro Iain White PM entitled *From No XII to the King Emperor by way of the Scotts and the Cairds*. This will be a quirky look at a wee slice of the history of No XII and how the Lodge connected to the bigger picture in the British Empire. Even though I say so myself, this is not to be missed!!

### Visit to The Lodge of Erskine No 1566 Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December 2017

We received a warm welcome from RWM Brother Ronald Armstrong of The Lodge of Erskine No 1566. After the usual formalities, our RWM received the gavel and Office Bearers exchanged. A short recess was called to prepare the candidate.

Donations to Lodge Property

From Bro HW Jones, Dir of Music, a George II farthing, in good condition, dated 1737 which year is coincident with the date of Lodge Charter.

From WG Buchanan PM, a framed photogravure of King Edward VII in masonic regalia.

The George II farthing has been in the Lodge safe and in all the inventories in all my years of membership (since 1974). However, the King Edward VII photogravure is a different story. A few years ago, I found it, frameless and in a very sorry state stuck in a recess high above the Lodge safe in the cupboard. To this day, I do not know what led me to look in that remote place. I took King Edward to a specialist framer in Glasgow and he was restored to his former glory. He now sits behind the RWM in the East at all our meetings.


