The Way We Were

I am grateful to Bro Alistair Glenny PM for this piece about one of our late brethren, Bro Andrew Cockle who passed to the grand Lodge Above on Saturday 24th March 2012.

Continuing Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII links with HM Services and the Royal Navy in particular (The ill-fated ship Aircraft Carrier HMS DASHER)

Every time I witness our Lodge Archivist, Past Master Iain White, scanning over old Lodge Minute Books and Memorabilia, my nose gets the better of me, and I often ask "Whit's goin' on noo?"

Recently, that very question prompted a conversation about the late Bro Andrew Cockle who was a well known Music Teacher, celebrated organist, and indeed was responsible for leading the praise at our 250th Anniverary Celebrations back in 1978, when the Most Worshipful Grand Master Mason, who was the current MWGMM's father, attended, with Office Bearers and Brethren from The Grand Lodge of Scotland.

The conversation continued with me saying "Yes, Jack (my brother) knew Andrew extremely well, as both shared a common love for the gentle art of angling travelling to many large and small lochs throughout Scotland in each others company." I reminded Iain also, that Andrew was an Officer in the Royal Navy and had served on Aircraft Carrier – HMS Dasher.

Early in the Second World War it became evident to our Admiralty of the urgent need for more Aircraft Carriers, and the thought was that Merchant Ships could be converted into fighting Aircraft Carriers in six months. Our Merchant Fleet was already fully committed and so six carriers were ordered which would be converted from Merchant Ships built in America. HMS Dasher which started out as Rio de Janeiro, was duly converted. During the work many of the

future crew were posted to New York to familiarise themselves with the vessel and among them was Coder Andrew Cockle from Greenock.

Andrew was to have a very lucky escape from that ill-fated ship. After serving as part of Operation Torch (The Landings on North Africa) and heavy activities off Oran, Dasher returned home via Gibraltar to Liverpool and, before leaving Liverpool for The Clyde, Coder Andrew Cockle left the ship to attend a training course.

Dasher arrived in Greenock (minus Andrew) on January 29th 1943, and from there encountered the severe weather conditions with those convoys heading to Murmansk, following which she spent weeks in the Caledon Yard in Dundee for repairs. It was in March 1943 that she re-entered the Clyde and at twenty minutes to five on March 27th 1943 the Dasher blew up and sank within eight minutes in the river between Ardrossan and Arran resulting in the loss of 379 lives.

The loss of these lives was second only, in home waters, to that of the Royal Oak and thankfully Brother Cockle not only survived but was able to continue until his passing to The Grand Lodge above, to teach and perform his musical talents to the benefit of many townsfolk.

72% of the crew of HMS DASHER were recorded dead or missing and six are buried in Greenock Cemetery. Such was the mystery surrounding the cause of the disaster that signals were put out saying

"THIS INCIDENT IS NOT, REPEAT, NOT TO BE SPOKEN ABOUT"

Having received Bro Alistair's piece, I did a bit of further research and found that the Greenock Telegraph of 28th March 2003 carried the following story

Victims of wartime ship explosion remembered

AN EMOTIONAL remembrance service was taking place today for a wartime ship which blew up as it headed for Greenock.

Aircraft carrier HMS Dasher exploded and sank off Arran on 27 March, 1943 with the loss of 379 lives, some from the Greenock area. Seven of the dead are buried in Greenock cemetery. The 60th anniversary of the tragedy was being marked by a wreath-laying ceremony in Ardrossan's *Dasher* Memorial Garden.

Among those attending was Andrew Cockle of Greenock, who de-coded signals on the ship for several months but was transferred six weeks before she sank.

Mr. Cockle, a former head teacher at Greenock Highlanders" Academy and former president of Inverclyde and Renfrew Musical Festival, said: 'The service will be an emotional occasion.'


