I had a chuckle to myself as I listened to David as I had a similar experience a few years ago but unfortunately with a slightly more unfortunate ending. It happened one Sunday evening at the very start of my Commission as Provincial Grand Master and I had a Divine Service to attend in Kilmarnock. I left my house in plenty of time to travel but as I was slightly unsure of exactly where I was going, I set my satnav with the address of the Church although it was only the last few miles where I required assistance as I was a fairly regular traveller down to Kilmarnock on business. I intended leaving Bishopton and travelling via the M8 to Tradeston, where I would take the M77 down to Kilmarnock. As I travelled along the M8 past Paisley, my satnav started to instruct me to leave the motorway at St. James and travel to Kilmarnock via Johnstone. Nonsense, at 6.00 pm on a Sunday evening, the motorway will be the quickest route I confidently told myself.

At the next two junctions, I was again advised me to leave the motorway and travel through Paisley and then through Hillington and again I ignored the advice. So I travelled onwards making my way down the M77 until I came to the cut-off for Kilmarnock, where I joined the dual carriageway through Kilmarnock only to be stopped by a unit of Traffic Police for exceeding the speed limit and although I remonstrated with them that I had not been doing more than 40 mph, they gleefully pointed out that the speed limit had recently been lowered on that stretch of road and was now 30 mph!

Not even pleading with them that I was on my way to a Church Service had any effect and I was duly booked (I'm sure if it had been the nice Adam McKenzie, I would have been let off with a warning)!

After giving my details, I made my way on to the Church and was just in time to join the deputation from the sister Provinces as they made their way into the Church.

As I sat there and composed my very flustered self, I remember looking up and saying a silent word to my Creator, that he might have been a wee bit easier on me considering that I was coming to visit Him, when all of a sudden that still small voice came into my head as if by way of a reply, "Well, I told you not once but three times to exit the motorway and you just ignored me!"

Yes, it certainly pays to listen to that still small voice of calm that guides us through life. When I was a wee laddie, my mother used to say to me if you ever have any doubts that what you are doing is right or wrong, simply pause and ask yourself if you would speak or act in such a way if your mother was standing beside you. Would she be proud of you and your actions?

For many of us, of course, our mothers are sadly no longer around to guide us but our Mother Lodge is, and its teachings provide guidance for our path in life if only we listen, open our minds and attempt to understand.

I understand that it takes fewer muscles to smile than it does to frown and in the same way, it takes less effort to be kind, tolerant and caring.

We are now heading into the lighter nights, warmer (hopefully) weather with Spring well on its way and just as we all want to let a little sunshine into our lives, let us also make a wee bit of effort to let that still small voice into our heads to guide us in our daily lives.

As an aside, the annual joint Divine Service of Lodge Cumberland Kilwinning No. 217 and Lodge Doric Kilwinning No. 68 will take place on Thursday 7th March and it would be nice to see ALL the Lodges represented at what is a very important date in a Lodge's calendar.



Master's Charity.

RWM Bro John Laird named the Master's Charity of Lodge Crawfurdsburn Greenock No. 1121 for session 2018/19 as "The Willow Ward, Orchard View Larkfield".

The Willow Ward is one of two wards located in the £7.3 million contemporary healthcare facility of Orchard View, which is situated in a prominent location on the Inverclyde Royal Hospital grounds. The facility provides adult and older peoples' continuing care mental health accommodation, with a particular focus on delivering a dementia friendly environment.

Within the complex there are 42 beds in total, with 30 of these dedicated to continuing care for older people.

The facilities include:

24 continuing care beds for patients with dementia

- 6 continuing care beds for patients with dementia and co-morbidity conditions
- 12 adult continuing care beds
- Social enterprise space including a cafe and hair-dressers
- Treatment rooms
- Multi-purpose social spaces for male and female patients

A cheque for £235 was donated recently and was well received as shown by the attached photo. It is envisaged that further donations will be made during the Lodge's session.
