The Importance of History

The book Jurassic Park was written by Michael Crichton. A very successful author, many of Crichton's novels were written in the science fiction genre. Yet Crichton was a man who had a keen interest in the past. Attributed to him is the quotation, "If you don't know history, then you don't know anything. You are a leaf that doesn't know it is part of a tree."

I came across this by chance the other day. Having spent my Saturday afternoon last weekend at the 75th Anniversary rededication of Lodge Inverkip Ardgowan No. 1425, history was very much in my mind. I was led to think about the importance of history to Masonic Lodges. Most Lodges were formed for a reason, chose their names for a reason and have survived till today for a reason. Of course, all these reasons are held within the history of the Lodge, as is much more information. information in the Minutes may relate directly to the Lodge itself (when a particular piece of the furnishings was donated and by whom), to Sister Lodges anniversaries significant (their brethren being honoured) or to the wider community (fund raising and cheque presentation or work done in support of local groups).

However, the information is only as good as the Lodge Secretary and his perception

of the requirements of the role that he is discharging.

It is fascinating to look through the Minute Books of No. XII and see how the historical value of the information therein changes as the Secretary changes.

In some cases, the information does not go beyond the very basic; sometimes the floor workers are not even mentioned! In other cases, we have a very full description of what went on at the meeting, up to, and including, a detailed synopsis of the Sermon at a Divine Service.

The Minute Book should be part of the social history of the town and detail the impact of events on the Lodge and the wider community. The weight of responsibility for that is on the Secretary's shoulders.

The Minutes are also very useful when questions of "tradition" arise in Lodges. They are much more reliable than word of mouth or the recollections of an old Past Master who, perhaps, has an axe to grind. The written records can prove, or disprove, questions about things "that have been always done that way in this Lodge." Sometimes a wee look at the old Minutes shows that they haven't!

Even with the most comprehensive minutes a problem arises when they are mislaid or, even worse, destroyed in some calamity like a fire. We have seen this happen in our own Province. Bro. Robert Harron's task of producing a history of Lodge Ardgowan for the 75th was made even more challenging because a significant portion of the records was/

was destroyed in the fire at 626 (along with that Lodge's own records). I was happy to help when Bro. Robert asked me if I could and I did a bit of reverse engineering from No. XII records. While it took many hours, it was a task that I really enjoyed.

My belief is that every Lodge should do everything that it can to make sure the historically important information that it possesses is made safe. With that in mind, a few years ago, No. XII purchased a big fireproof safe in which all our important records are now stored. Furthermore, the records are, bit by bit, being digitised and stored electronically on disc with copies stored both in the fireproof safe and away from the Lodge. The process of digitising the records is also being carried out by Lodge Crawfurdsburn. Other Lodges in the Province may be doing the same; if not I respectfully suggest that they consider it. RWPGM of Glasgow, Bro. Andy Mushet is the man to contact about digitising. His company, Anderson Printers, is doing the work for No. XII and Lodge Crawfurdsburn.

In conclusion, I return to where I started viz. the quote from Michael Crichton. He refers to the notion of belonging and of being part of something as being conditional on knowing the history of the organisation. This takes me back to where I was in the last *Twelve Talk* when I was lamenting the apparent lack of interest in Masonic Education amongst the brethren. In short, awareness of the past consolidates the present and prepares us for the future. Then we all know the tree that our wee leaf belongs to! Just saying...

The Old Jewels of the Lodge


These old jewels will have considerable financial value, being solid silver. They were presented to the Lodge by RWM Bro. Alexander Govan in 1737. They were lost for some time but returned in the manner described in the Minute excerpt below

Council Chambers Greenock Thursday evening 23rd February 1882

William Allison RWM, in the Chair

Discovery of Old Jewels for some time supposed lost

Thereafter, DM Edward Blackmore read to the meeting a correspondence which had taken place between the Secretary of the Lodge and Brother John Fleming of Edinburgh relative to the discovery of the ancient and long lost jewels of the Lodge by John Kerr Gray Esq. late Town Clerk of Greenock and having referred in appropriate language to the interesting discovery which had been made Brother Blackmore presented the Jewels to the RWM on the Lodge's behalf amid the acclamations of the assembled brethren. The Secretary was instructed to write letters to Brother John Fleming of Edinburgh thanking him for the kind interest he had taken in the matter and to Mr. John Kerr Gray thanking him cordially
