From the old minute books of No XII

I have mentioned before that the celebration of the Festival of St John the Evangelist used to be a major event in the Lodges in the Province and beyond. Below is the minute for 1907. The meeting was obviously well attended for the collection of $\pounds 2$ 5/- would be $\pounds 239.51$ in to-day's money!

The practice of deputations being sent out to Sister Lodges and received was an interesting one too given that getting from the Town Hall in Greenock to the various places visited without the aid of motor cars (one would presume) would not have been easy. Deputations were received from Paisley and Kilmacolm but it has to be remembered that the Princes Pier railway line would have taken you from Kilmacolm to Lynedoch Street Station just above the Wellpark back then.

Another wee item of interest is that later in the evening the Deputations sent out from No XII returned! This is all the more commendable given that the 'the remainder of the evening was spent in harmony' after the business had been concluded.

Friday 27th December 1907

The Secretary also read a Circular from Grand Lodge in reference to Grand Lodge Annuity and Benevolent Fund, and in accordance the instructions contained therein, a Collection was taken during the evening which realized the sum of $\pounds 2-5/-$

Deputations conveying the fraternal greetings of the Lodge were despatched to the following sister Lodges; Doric Kilwinning No 68, Greenock St John No 175, Cumberland Kilwinning No 217 and Firth of Clyde No 626.

Harmony

The Lodge was then called from Labour to Refreshment and the remainder of the evening was spent in harmony.

Deputations Received

Deputations were received and welcomed from the above-mentioned Lodges and also from Lodge No 370 Renfrew County Kilwinning Paisley and Lodge Sir Michael No 989 Kilmacolm. The Brethren of these Deputations ably assisted the Brethren of the Lodge in providing a varied and enjoyable programme of vocal and instrumental music. Telegram received (from Bro Martin Jamieson)

The following telegram was received and read to the meeting: "Accept hearty good wishes for pleasant evening to all. May apostolic blessing of Holy St John be with you. Jamieson, Ardgowan, South Shields"

On the call of the RWM, Bro Jamieson's health was enthusiastically toasted.

In due time the Visiting deputations from other Lodges took their departure and the deputations sent out by this Lodge having returned, the Brethren were recalled to Labour. Before closing, the RWM thanked the Brethren for their attendance also thanked all who had contributed in any way to the success of the meeting.

Thereafter, the Lodge was closed in due and ancient form.
