

Next Meeting Tuesday 17th January Visitation by The Lodge of Erskine No 1566

Previous Meeting Tuesday 6th December The Annual Divine Service

The Annual Divine Service was again conducted by Bro John C Glenny PM. We are very fortunate to have Bro Jack to support us in this capacity, for as well as being an accomplished ritual worker and a lover of the Craft, Bro Jack is a Reader of The Church of Scotland, and has conducted services around the country, In 2009, he was invited to address the Scottish Parliament at their "Time for Reflection" which they hold at the beginning of each new session. Bro Jack was Moderator of the Greenock and Paisley Presbytery in 2006.

The whole service was spiritually uplifting and delivered in Bro Jack's customary engaging style. After the readings Psalms Chapter 36 verses 5-9 and Jeremiah Chapter 18 verses 1-6 delivered by Bro J. Robert Crossan WSW and St John Chapter 15 verses 9-17 by Brian McFadyen WJW the theme for Bro Jack's sermon was 'The Potter's Wheel'. The potter, Bro Jack told us, is one of the oldest jobs in manufacturing and requires great skill. Jeremiah is sent to the potter and sees him at work, creating artefacts of beauty and acknowledges the skill of the craftsman. On occasion, the work may not be so good and the product does not meet expectations. However, nothing is wasted for the clay can be remoulded and reshaped. Bro Jack told us that the Bible saw God as the potter and the clay as his people. We are moulded in His image and it is comforting to know that when times are difficult or confusing, we may be remoulded into something new. The connections between the Lodge and its members as the potter and his clay are clear as we all work to best serve His purpose.

We were delighted to be joined again by family and friends at the Service as well as brethren from Provincial Grand Lodge and visiting Lodges.

I've always enjoyed hearing Iain speak, whether it's at a Burns Supper, delivering a paper or just chatting at harmony. It's just a shame that Bro Iain's research was hampered by holes in the minute books and other documentation. A poignant reminder that our great fraternity's history may, one day, be lost because newer members didn't take enough interest in the history of their lodges and speak with some of the older brethren. I hope Bro Iain publishes his research. I know I would be one of the first in line for a copy.

Singing Christmas carols and enjoy some ginger wine and mince pies in the company of friends was the perfect end to the evening and the perfect way to get well and truly into the Christmas

The way we were – 1994 Re-installation of Bro Ian M Ross

'Big Jock;' was one of the Lodge's real characters. A retired senior police officer, he had an additional job or two after that, so much so that we called him the man with 3 pensions! Notwithstanding this, he would only ever speculate with 1 ticket at the raffle. In proffering his 10p he'd say when challenged, 'It only takes one ticket to win.' In these days before morning suits were de rigeur for Office Bearers and Past Masters, John had a distinctive dark, green, checked suit. As young office bearers, we speculated that it must be the only suit he had until the evening of the Provincial Visitation came around and Big Jock appeared resplendent in a dark blue number. Away from the Lodge, Bro John was a rugby enthusiast and was involved with Greenock Wanderers. In fact he lived down at Fort Matilda opposite the playing fields. After his passing, No XII presented a trophy to the Wanderers. It is awarded annually to their young player of the year, No XII regularly sponsors the Wanderers financially as part of our desire to support young people in the community.

Not to forget Bro Ian M Ross, he had two very successful terms as RW Master and he regularly Chairs the Burns Supper for us and will Toast the Lassies this year.
