Bro Henry Sebbon Tibbles PM 4th November 1919 – 11th April 2019

We were all greatly saddened with the news that Bro Henry Sebbon Tibbles PM had passed to the Grand Lodge Above on the morning on Sunday 14th April just over 6 months before what would have been his 100th birthday. Bro. Henry had been on his own since 2015 when he lost his beloved wife Muriel and things were not quite the same for him from then. He had been in No. XII for just under 77 years! The piece below was published on the occasion of Bro. Henry's Platinum Jubilee in 2012 when he attended the Annual Divine Service on 4th December to receive his Diploma.

Henry Sebbon Tibbles is a remarkable character in many ways and a very special gentleman. He was 70 years a member of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII on 10th November 2012 and receives his Platinum Jubilee Diploma at the Lodge Annual Divine Service in the Town Hall this evening.

Born on 4th November 1919 in Minster, by Sheerness (Kent), he took his first degree during the Second World War on 10th November 1942. At that time, he was in the Royal Navy and stationed locally. He spent all of the war years in the Navy, marrying Gourock girl Muriel along the way. They have now been together for over 70 years. When Henry returned to civvy street, the printing trade beckoned, and he rose to the position of Company Director. Unfortunately for No XII, promotion took Henry to London, but XII's loss was The Scots' Lodge's gain and he joined No 2319 (English Constitution) on 24th April 1969. Henry's enthusiasm led him to be installed as Worshipful Master of The Scots' Lodge in 1980. At this time, he brought a deputation up to the Town Hall when Bro Kenneth K Morrison was Master of No XII and very strong links between the two Lodges began to develop. These have been further cemented over the years by visitations to Greenock and London.


Henry has held many senior positions in the craft and amongst these are the following: London Grand Rank (1989), Worshipful Master of Scots' Mark Master Masons Lodge No 406 (EC) (1984), Grand Steward of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England (1987), President of the Board of Grand Stewards (1987), Commander of the Scots' Lodge Royal Ark Mariners No 406 (EC) (1994), Provincial Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank (1999) Honorary Provincial Grand Senior Warden of Renfrewshire West (2003) and membership of many other Masonic Orders. He is well respected by the brethren of the Scottish and English constitutions, but by none more so than those here in his Mother Lodge.

After Henry's retirement and return to Scotland, No XII was delighted to welcome him back on a regular basis. His great dedication to the Craft led him to perform a number of duties to help No XII, for example filling the offices of Tyler, Treasurer, Worshipful Junior Warden and Worshipful Senior Warden. He assumed the chair of his Mother Lodge for the first time in 2001, aged 82 years and 16 days. Henry was awarded Distinguished Service Membership by No XII in 1990, received his 50 Year Jubilee Diploma in 1992 and his Diamond Jubilee Diploma 10 years later.

To-night we honour him for his 70 years' membership of No XII and extend to him our appreciation and sincere thanks for his immense contribution over the years.

Bro. Henry was generous in kind and in spirit and a gentleman in the truest sense of the word. The Grand Lodge Above is enriched by his presence.

At his funeral service in Greenock Crematorium on Thursday 25th April, the Lodge was well represented as was the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West and the Sister Lodges. RW Master Bro. Bob Crossan laid a sprig of acacia on the coffin of our dear, departed Brother.

After checking with our Brethren, we decided this was okay. Our own Mark Degree was actually two weeks before our visit, so this would be a good practice run.

So, the 30th April arrived before we knew it and off we went on our sojourn to Dundonald. As you would expect, we were given a really warm welcome from all the brethren of Lodge Burns Dundonald and their visitors for the evening, of which there were plenty, about 75 Brethren being present at the meeting.

After changing halls to accommodate the large crowd the meeting started. We remained outside as were we to be admitted as a Deputation. After about 20 mins, we were called for and duly led into the Lodge room. After the usual formalities the Gavel was presented to me by RWM Bro John McNish, for which I thanked him in the usual manner and we then proceeded to confer the Mark Degree on their candidate. I must admit it was a very fine rendition of the Mark with everyone being at the top of their game on the evening, just as they were two weeks before in our own Lodge. I then presented their RWM with the Gavel and he thanked me, and all from No XII, for such a fine degree. After the collection was uplifted we were asked if we would like to retire from the Lodge and we duly did and immediately received kind lodge hospitality Thank you to everyone who made the journey down to Dundonald for what I would call a very enjoyable night.

Test and Capitation Fees



It was previous degree in April was the Mark. It was gratifying to see a number of candidates. The Mark in 1920 was a little different ...

Tuesday 21st May 1920

The Mark Degree was conferred upon 85 Brethren, 81 of whom were members of this Lodge

Presentations

After the lodge was closed in due and ancient form, the Brethren adjourned to the Town Hall.

A toast list was submitted by the RW Master, an interesting part of which was the presentation by the Lodge to Bro. Robert Thexton IPM of a divan easy chair, and a gold wristlet watch for Miss Barbara Thexton.

At a later part of the evening, Bro. RL Scott PM offered the congratulations of the Lodge to the RW Master on his marriage and presented him with a Sheraton Clock together with fruit stands and a case of silver spoons for Mrs. Macpherson.

The 2019 candidate total of 5 from No XII and 1 from a Sister Lodge pales into insignificance compared to the 85 who took the Degree in 1920. Interest in Freemasonry was very high in the wake of The Great War.

John Adamson Trophy Greenock Wanderers RFC Presentation 2019

The Lodge has had links with Greenock Wanderers over the years, with coaches, players and former players often being members of No XII. Bro John Adamson, who joined No XII in 1951 aged 34 and a Detective Constable, and was Right Worshipful Master in 1966 – 68, was an enthusiastic Wanderer. He passed to the Grand Lodge Above in April 2004 and No XII donated a Trophy to Greenock Wanderers in John's memory to be competed for on an annual basis.
