Our Previous Meeting The Jack and Alistair Glenny Memorial Lecture The 1st/5th Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders In Gallipoli Tuesday 7th January 2025

The 5th Argylls was the local Territorial Battalion of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. The battalion was sent to Gallipoli in 1915 and took part in the Battle of Achi Baba on 12th July. Over 100 officers and men were lost in the charge on the Turkish trenches.



The lecture was delivered by local historian and Gallipoli expert Alan Cumming (left). His presentation was followed by a complementary one from Bro Iain White PM which had a focus on local freemasons, from No. XII and Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175, who served with the 1st/5th in Gallipoli including Bros. Duncan C Kerr MC, James Reid Kerr and Robert Alan Clapperton-Stewart.

Relevant local societies and individuals were invited and this was very successful with members of these groups taking up more than half of the attendance. This was reflected in letters of thanks received.

A friend and I attended the event on Tuesday night. My pal is a Territorial Army veteran with a particular interest in military history. He enjoyed the talks even more than I did.



Bro. James Lever PM Lodge Montgomerie Kilwinning Skelmorlie No. 624 Honorary Member No. XII

I have had a couple of features on Bro. Jim Lever recently and here he is again! He was made an Honorary Member of No. XII because of his support for the Lodge and regular visits. Jim is, of course, a Past Master of Lodge Montgomerie Kilwinning Skelmorlie No. 624, having been in the Chair from December 1980 till December 1982. I suspect that the photograph below was taken at one of his Installations.



I was given the photo by Bro. KK Morrison PM of No. XII. Kenny is on the extreme right. With him are (from left) Bros Willie Whyte PM (Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175), Bob Stone PM Lodge Cumberland Kilwinning No. 217 and, of course, Jim.

Here is where it starts to get interesting! Back in the day, Installations at 624 were held on the second Friday in December. This clashed with the Installations at Lodge Doric Kilwinning No. 68 in Port Glasgow. This gave the Master of No. XII a challenge because he could not be in 2 places at one time. The consequence was that No. XII's Master and Wardens would attend 68 in our own Province; the Immediate Past Master and Deacons would go to 624, in Skelmorlie, in the Province of Ayrshire.

So, back to the photo! If it is an Installation, we should expect to see to No. XII Immediate Past Master in the photo and he is indeed – Bro. KK Morrison. The other 2 visiting brethren are also Past Masters as may be seen from their regalia.

These 3 Past Masters were in the Chair as follows:

Bro. Willie Whyte - 175 - October 1977 till October 1979 Bro KK Morrison - XII - November 1979 till November 1981 Bro. Bob Stone - 217 - November 1979 till November 1981

Bro. Jim Lever is wearing his Master's regalia and he was in the Chair from December 1980 till December 1982.

The photo is labelled 1980 but that cannot be correct. If it were 1980, Bro. Bob Stone and Kenny Morrison would still have been Masters of their respective lodges and wearing that regalia. They are not and both are wearing Past Masters jewels which each would have received in November 1981. Therefore, for Jim Lever to be Master of 624 and Bob and Kenny to be Past Masters it had to be the Installation of December 1981 – a year later!


No XII on the Road (2) Lodge Firth of Clyde Gourock No 626 Saturday 16th January 2025
