The West Column



Hau'd yer wheest! A great Scottish phrase which needs no explanation to a true Scot! For those who perhaps require a translation, it is simply "be quiet" or "keep silent"!

We talk a lot in Masonic circles about dignity and decorum but what do we really mean by the phrase? Further down, I've plugged the newish publication from Grand Lodge on the subject of Masonic Etiquette and Best Practice and if you haven't already obtained a copy I would urge you to do so as it provides a superb guide to the subject and answers many questions which may have arisen over the years about how and why we should conduct ourselves at meetings.

Decorum – from the Latin, meaning "that which is seemly". A dictionary definition is "dignified propriety of behaviour, speech and dress – an observance of polite society – a requirement of correct behaviour". That is all quite clear but unfortunately, we then come down to personal translation. What seems to be acceptable behaviour for some at a football match nowadays seems to vary dramatically from what others see as acceptable behaviour. But back to the word Decorum and its definition in the Grand lodge booklet.

Etiquette takes the form of proper decorum. That means that loud or coarse talk, restless moving about, laughter and private conversations during ceremonial work, giving no attention to the work in hand is unacceptable. It disturbs the harmony of the Lodge. Degrees must be conferred not only in as perfect a ritualistic form as is possible but also with impressiveness. The impression made upon a candidate in his first Degree will remain with him throughout his life. Hums of conversation, tutting, restless moving about, have no place in the ceremonial work of any Lodge.

The above paragraph is extracted from the book on Masonic Etiquette referred to below and dare I be so bold as to suggest that it is that very decorum which makes our meetings so different from any other gatherings.

Why do I bring this up? Simply because I have noted with sadness, the number of times that an office-bearer is delivering a piece of ritual on the floor of his Lodge and been distracted by whispers from those present. The really sad thing is that this is often from those who should know better. Past Masters with years of experience behind them who should know how easy it is to be distracted by unseemly noise from the columns are often the worst of culprits.

Criticism of an office-bearer performing ritual work, should be done in a kindly and helpful way, preferably AFTER the meeting. Likewise, those with a sweet tooth, if they could refrain from unwrapping particularly sticky toffees during the delivery of a piece of ritual, I'm sure the office-bearer on the floor would appreciate it. There is plenty of time between the delivery of separate pieces of ritual, to speak quietly and briefly to your neighbour or unwrap that toffee if you really must.

Does it make a difference? During one recent Master Mason's degree, I happened to be delivering a prayer to a candidate but was distracted by a conversation taking place between senior office-bearers of the Lodge. With over 40 years of experience, it didn't deflect me from my duty but I'm not sure what thoughts the candidate might have been thinking during a piece of very solemn work!

The section on Decorum within the booklet also includes the advice: *The degrees must be conferred not only in as perfect a ritualistic form as possible but also with impressiveness.*

So I appeal to you all brethren, the office-bearer who is on the floor, young or old, experienced or inexperienced, has taken the trouble to learn his ritual. He is to be supported and encouraged, not interrupted by inane chatter or unnecessary noise. If he makes a mistake, criticism should be constructive and kindly given. It should encourage him to strive to do better and not to give up.

The best way we can support him is by paying him the attention which his study, his work and his courage in speaking in public warrant.

Perhaps it is also one way that we can also improve our retention figures?





Acting the goat!



That very nice Brother Eddie Lapsley (68) from whom contributions to the West Column are always welcome, was kind enough to forward to me an extract from a recent copy of the Greenock Telegraph's "Stories from yesteryear". It was from the Varioriums from February 1909 and read as follows; "A Goat strayed into a hall in the neighbourhood the other night where a Masonic dance was being held. Who let the amiable animal out of the Lodge repository"?

It brought to mind an item which I included in the "Short History of Lodge Firth of Clyde, Gourock No. 626" which was compiled after the disastrous Lodge fire destroyed many of our records in 2008. While researching the membership of the early days of the Lodge, it was noted that the membership increased greatly during the war years and in particular during the years immediately preceding and during the Great War.

In addition to drawing many members from amongst the crew of HMS Benbow, a battleship stationed on the Lower Clyde between 1894 and 1904, the Lodge also had its membership boosted by members of 2/1 Company Clyde, Royal Garrison Artillery, which was stationed at Fort Matilda for coastal defence purposes. As many members of the garrison became members of the Lodge, there is a story that for one particular meeting, the many members of the Lodge formed up and marched in procession the mile or so to the meeting preceded by their regimental mascot – a Goat!

The tale is further compounded by the story that there did appear in the accounts of the Lodge at that time, the cost of feed for the self-same goat. I could not find any further information that would substantiate the claim but in any event it's a good story!

Now we cannot guarantee the appearance of a goat at the forthcoming Provincial Ball (perhaps a few folk acting the goat) but we can assure you of an excellent evening so don't miss out and reserve those tickets and tables without delay!

Now here is a wee **Blast from the Past**. A photograph kindly provided by Brother Iain White, Past Master of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No. XII of the Installation as Provincial Grand Master of Brother William M H Macfarlane which took place in 1988, within the Temple of Lodge Doric Kilwinning No. 68.
