Our Previous Meeting – Tuesday 15th September 2015 A Deputation from Lodge Renfrew County Kilwinning No 370 confers a Passing

The brethren of 370's degree was enjoyed by the large attendance in the Saloon. Particularly appreciated was the Charge delivered by Bro Tom Nixon PM which was based on the symbolism of the Coats of Arms of Greenock and the Shaw Stewart family, the history of Greenock. The history of No XII was intertwined throughout. It was a wonderful Charge.

When I joined No XII in 1974, there was a very strong link between the two Lodges. At that time, 370 met in the Town Hall in Paisley and No XII used to travel there at the Mark degree each year, and similarly at the No XII Mark a deputation would visit from 370. As I said in a previous issue of XII Talk, the urban myth at the time was that this relationship had arisen because Bro Robert J Drainer PM had been Rector of Camphill Senior Secondary School in



Paisley in the 1950s, a post he held after being head at Gourock High. Bob was a teacher of Classics originally. Indeed, he was RWM of No XII in 1951-53 at the time when he was Rector at Camphill.

I remember Bro Bob well as a Past Master with a gravelly, imperious voice, flawless floor work and always a kind word of encouragement for 'youngsters' like Hector Macphail, Jim Adams and me as we made our first tentative steps on to the floor. Bob is described in the Camphill website as having the 'reputation of a visionary, gentleman and a scholar'. These are words that are peculiarly appropriate and well deserved.

Bob Drainer as Rector of Camphill Senior Secondary

That all made sense to me until before the recess when I was, sad man that I am, looking thorough some old minute books and found the following evidence of a strong relationship with Lodge Renfrew County Kilwinning some 50 years before Bob became Camphill's Rector. I published this before but it bears repetition.

Thursday 27th December 1906

Bro Col. DFD Neill IPM, in the Chair

(Festival of St John the Evangelist)

Vote of Condolence with RWM

Thereupon Bro Neill made reference in most sympathetic terms to the bereavement which fallen on the family of the RW Master (Bro RL Scott), through the death of his Mother, and it was agreed to recording the Minutes the deep sympathy felt by the Brethren for the RW Master and his Brother Mr. Chas C Scott and the Secretary was instructed to intimate same to them. Deputations Dispatched and received.

Deputations were dispatched to visit Lodges No 68, Doric Kilwinning, No 175, Gnk St John, No 217, Cumberland Kilwinning, No 626, Firth of Clyde, and No 989, 'Sir Michael' Kilmacolm. In the course of the evening Deputations were received from the same lodges and also from No 370, Renfrew County Kilwinning and No 624 Montgomerie Kilwinning Skelmorlie.

Friday 27th December 1907

At a Meeting of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No 12, held in the Saloon of the Town hall on Friday 27th Dec 1907 at 730pm to celebrate the Festival of St John the Evangelist

Deputations conveying the fraternal greetings of the Lodge were dispatched to the following sister Lodges; Doric Kilwinning No 68, Greenock St John No 175, Cumberland Kilwinning No 217 and Firth of Clyde No 626.

The Lodge was then called from Labour to Refreshment and the remainder of the evening was spent in harmony.

Deputations Received

Deputations were received and welcomed from the above-mentioned Lodges and also from **Lodge No 370 Renfrew County Kilwinning Paisley** and Lodge Sir Michael No 989 Kilmacolm. The Brethren of these Deputations ably assisted the Brethren of the Lodge in providing a varied and enjoyable programme of vocal and instrumental music.

I believe that the relationship must have been strong back then for the brethren to travel, presumably by steam train, in the depths of winter, and two days after Christmas, from Paisley, in the days before the almost universal ownership of the motor car.

So perhaps yet another No XII urban myth is exposed! There is no doubt that the relationship MAY have strengthened through Bro Bob Drainer working in Paisley but he does not seem to have been its instigator. Unfortunately, by the time I was asking the question back in the 80s, Bro Bob had passed to the Grand Lodge Above and I never took it up with his son Bro Roy Drainer (also a Past Master of No XII and one of my Installing Masters in 1989 and 1990) because I took what I was told at face value and I know that the Past Master concerned spoke to me in all sincerity.

Alan D Beck IPM is honoured by Lodge The Prince's No 607

On Monday 2nd of November, our IPM, Bro Alan D Beck, will be installed into the Chair of King Solomon in his affiliate lodge, The Prince's, 607 at their home in the Masonic Temple, 3 Mafeking St, Glasgow (off Copeland Rd, just behind Ibrox Stadium). The meeting starts at 530pm.

Bro Alan was already an honorary member of The Prince's when he affiliated to the lodge just over a year ago to "help out". As we understand it, Bro Alan is the third member of No XII to affiliate to 607, following in the footsteps of Bro Robert Lyons Scott PM in the 1920s and Bro Iain White PM in 2013. Bro Alan will be installed into the Chair by Bro Iain, assisted by Bro Bobby Shaw PM. On the evening of installation, our own RWPGM, Bro James P Livingstone, will deliver the Toast to the Lodge and RWM, Bro Allan I MacFeate will lead the deputation of the visiting brethren. It is hoped that as many brethren as possible will support Bros, Alan, Iain, Jim and Allan on the evening.

The World Famous No XII Raffles
