Here we are at Issue 100. It seems a long time ago that I proposed at a General Committee Meeting that, in order to boost interest amongst the members I might send out a wee Newsletter before each meeting. In the grand scheme of things, it wasn't that long ago because it was on 12<sup>th</sup> January 2010 that the First Edition was published. I have attached it for your interested and a poor wee emaciated thing it is compared to more recent editions.

*Twelve Talk* has grown and developed over the years in response to contributions and ideas from Brethren and my own preoccupation with recording the life of the Lodge and looking into its past. It would be fair to say that this growth and development mirrors that of No XII itself, for the Lodge that we see today bears no comparison to what it was like back then in the same way that is true for *Twelve Talk*. Much has happened in the intervening years and a few things have given me great pleasure as a Past Master of 26 years standing and a member with 43 years under my belt.

We have seen many new Initiates in recent years and they bring an

energy and focus to our work. We have also seen a return to the high standards of floor work and administration that had always characterised No XII and that are so important. Quality, dignity and decorum must always be our watchwords. Our *Back to the Future* initiative has brought back many important traditions of No XII that were in danger of being forgotten and yet this has not impeded the progress of the Lodge as it also changes and develops to meet the demands of 21<sup>st</sup> Century life. Very soon this will be cemented by the publication of the No XII Manual that will draw so much of this together and clarify ritual and operational matters – at last! The profile of the Lodge in the local community has risen dramatically, aided greatly by our charitable work and support for other local organisations. Hand in hand with this has been a consolidation and growth of our partnership with Inverclyde Council and we are grateful for the interest shown by its elected members and officers in what we do. Talking of 'no comparison' the Saloon is looking spectacular now with its refurbishment and upgrade by the Council, soon to be enhanced by a new floor. Despite all of these things, we must never be complacent in No XII. American advertising executive, Jay Chiat, once said, "I'm uncomfortable when I am feeling comfortable". This should be our mantra as we head into the next 100 *Twelve Talks* and towards the Tercentenary in 2028. Don't get too comfortable!!

*In the last edition of Twelve Talk, reference was made to talks and lectures of different types being given in No XII 'back in the day'. Some illustrative examples were given and here are some more ...*

### Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> February 1936

Bro Peter R Jacobs, RW Master, in the Chair

Lecture by Bro Dr RT Halliday on 'Early Masons and their Work'

The Lodge was then reduced to the EA Degree and thereafter called from Labour when Bro Dr RT Halliday JP, the Grand Lodge Senior Grand Deacon gave a most interesting lecture on "Early masons and their work" which was illustrated by lantern slides. The lecturer had the attention of a large audience in his visits to abbeys, cathedrals and ancient buildings and his descriptions of different forms of architecture was most instructive.

At the close of the lecture Bro Jacobs conveyed the thanks of the Lodge to Bro Halliday for the pleasure he had given, not only to the brethren of the Lodge, but those of sister lodges whose presence he cordially welcomed.

Bros Sir Hugh Shaw Stewart, RL Scott and RC Smith also congratulate Bro Halliday, and he in his acknowledgement expressed his indebtedness to Bro WS Jamieson the lanternist.

### **Meeting on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February 1937**

Visit of Provincial Grand Lodge

During the working of the Degree the annual visitation of Provincial Grand Lodge was made. The Deputation was headed by Bro RA Clapperton-Stewart, PG Secretary who, with his officers, took over the conduct of the Lodge. After taking the Chair, Bro Clapperton-Stewart indicated that it had been the intention of Bro RL Scott, PG Depute Master, to represent Bro Sir Hugh Shaw Stewart PG Master, but that owing to illness neither he nor Bro RS Murray PG Grand Sub Master was able to be present.

Lecture on the Queen Mary by Bro Cadenhead

Thereafter the Lodge was called to Harmony in the course of which Bro John W Cadenhead gave a lecture on the 'Queen Mary' which was illustrated by slides with Bro WS Jamieson as lanternist. The lecture was listened to with pleasure and Bro Cadenhead was complimented in being able in a little over 30 minutes, to show us the vessel from the laying of the keel to its arrival in Southampton.

### **Meeting on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 1937**

From the dim past, Bro Caird traced the origin of many of the symbols and signs which have been passed on through the ages and the relation of their foundations to modern psychology

At the close of the Degree the Lodge went into Harmony and Bro Captain James Murray, Governor of HM Prison, gave a very interesting address based on 'Prison Reform'. The lecture was much appreciated by the brethren.

### **Meeting on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> November 1938**

Lecture by Bro Ex-Provost JM Adam Gourock on 'Gourock Looking Backward'

After closing the meeting, as a Lodge in due and ancient form, Bro Buchanan called upon Bro Ex-Provost Adam to give his lecture on 'Gourock Looking Backward'. Bro Adam, in an interesting manner, traced the history of Gourock from the 14<sup>th</sup> Century and, with an excellent collection of slides, illustrated its growth from a tiny fishing village to the prosperous burgh of today. To many of the older brethren the scenes depicted of bygone days, brought back to them happy memories.

On the call of the RW Master, Bro Adam was accorded a hearty vote of thanks and with it was included Bro John Liddell, the lanternist, also of Gourock.

Bro Caird referred to the honour of MBE which had been conferred by HM The King on Bro Wm M McKechnie, Deputy Chief Constable. It was resolved that this tribute to a worthy brother be recorded in the Minutes and that our warm congratulations be conveyed to Bro McKechnie

Fellowcraft Tracing Board by Bro PR Jacobs

The Lodge was then called to Harmony when Bro PR Jacobs PM gave a lucid explanation of the words and signs pertaining to the Fellowcraft degree and their relation to the symbols depicted on the Tracing Board. Bro Jacobs was commended on the manner in which he dealt with his subject by Bros. Caird IPM, JW Turner PM and John Sinclair PM of Lodge Crawfordsburn and the brethren expressed appreciation in their vote of thanks.

### **Meeting on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> January 1939**

It was intimated that arrangements had been made with Past Master Andrew MacBride of Glasgow to give a lecture on "The First Scottish Provincial Grand Lodge" which was instituted on 7<sup>th</sup> February 1739. This date will coincide with the night of the lecture 200 years later. Bro MacBride in his paper deals with the pioneer work for Masonry carried out by the Drummond family whose association with Lodge Greenock Kilwinning forms part of our history.

## Meeting on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> February 1939

Lecture by Bro Andrew MacBride PM Glasgow on “The First Scottish Provincial Grand Lodge”

After according a welcome to visiting brethren, an expressing his appreciation for the large attendance, the RW Master called upon Bro Andrew MacBride Past president of the Glasgow Masters’ and Past Masters’ Association for his lecture. The subject was “The First Scottish Provincial Grand Lodge” which was instituted on this date 200 years ago. It is of special interest to our members that the first Provincial Grand Master was Alexander Drummond, Collector of Customs in Greenock, and RW Master of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning. His commission from John, The Earl of Kintore, Grand Master Mason of Scotland was to visit the lodges in Argyll, Clydesdale, Dumbarton, Renfrew and Stirling and he continue to hold this office till 1742. the area may seem widespread but account has to be taken that in those days there were few Lodges. A comparison may be made with Glasgow which then had 3 Lodges and now has 62.

Bro MacBride read extracts from the various Lodges as far as Inverness which were visited by Bro Drummond whose commission was to act as Deputy for the Grand Master Mason. In these visits Greenock Kilwinning is included and there are several interesting records in our minutes of his visits to this Lodge which then met in the house of David Govan, Vintner.

Bro MacBride in an interesting manner traced the history of Masonry from the 16<sup>th</sup> Century and paid tribute to the pioneer work carried out by Bro Drummond whose zeal and devotion for the Craft in those days, helped to lay the foundation of Masonry in Scotland.

Bro Drummond had also the honour of forming the first Scottish Lodge abroad which was instituted in Aleppo in 1744, when he was appointed HM Consul there. He called the Lodge Drummond Kilwinning from Greenock.

Bro MacBride was greatly interested in the first minute book of Greenock Kilwinning which records the institution of the Lodge in the house of Robert Moore, Postmaster, on 27<sup>th</sup> December 1727.)

After remarks by Bro RA Clapperton-Stewart, PG Secy., Bro RC Smith PM and others, on the call of the RW Master a hearty vote of thanks was accorded to Bro MacBride.

***It’s back to the future right enough! Perhaps even more thought should be given to the promotion of this type of activity as a means to enrich the Masonic experiences of the Brethren.***
